April 2, 2017

Board Members: Scott Schnuckle-President, Mike Flanagan-Vice President, Gary Ziehmman-Treasurer, Peg Hartung, Ron Markfelder, Chuck Salter, Brian Sams, Dennis Smith and Mary Thibert-Secretary.

Absent Board Members: Jon-Scott Johnson, Ron Mash, Paul Baker and Peggy Swalm.

Visitors: Joel, Cindy and Mark Racchini, Chris Ziehmman and David Thibert.

Secretary's Report: Minutes from the Fish Trap Lake Property Owners Association (FTLPOA) fall board meeting were submitted by Mary Thibert. Gary Ziehmman motioned to accept the minutes. Brian Sams seconded it. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Gary Ziehmman submitted the Treasurer's report. Current membership for 2017 is 67 paid to date and we had 197 paid members in 2016 Gary requested approval of annual payment of \$250 to the Newsletter Editor, \$250 to the Secretary, \$300 to the Treasurer, and to pay up to \$500 for beaver control and up to \$300 for water quality testing reimbursement. Scott Schnuckle motioned to approve these expenses. Mike Flanagan seconded it. The motion carried. Gary Ziehmman and Mary Thibert abstained from the vote.

Old Business:

- a. County Variances:** Mike Flanagan reported on several new variance requests and also provided an update on granted variances.
- b. Aquatic Invasive Species Update and Plans:** There are 4 different entities which are working together to protect the water quality in Fish Trap Lake and/or our three other area lakes. They are The Fish Trap Lake Property Owners Association (FTLPOA), The Fish Trap Lake Property Owners Association Endowment Fund with the Initiative Foundation (IFEFF), the Lake Improvement District (LID) and the QUAD Lakes Association (QLA). In the spring newsletter Chuck Salter will define each entity and their role. QLA received a grant last year to prevent the spread of Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) which was used for signage at each lake accesses. The QLA works with Morrison County (MC) and the DNR to prevent the spread of AIS. FTL has been chosen by MC for a pilot project for watercraft inspection at the landing. MC is using some of their funding by providing additional DNR inspectors at FTL's public access. MC also plans to educate private inspectors. DNR inspectors can enforce the rules and issue fines while private inspectors only have the authority to check boats and refer violations to law enforcement. There have been some complaints about the weeds at the public access and the LID is looking into possible additional treatments in this area.
- c. Railroad Updates:** Paul Baker was unable to attend the meeting but, Gary Ziehmman reported that Scandia Valley Township has come to an agreement with the BNSF and now it's up to Morrison County to come to an agreement with them also. There is no definite date or timeframe at this time.
- d. Water Quality and Water Study Updates:** Last year Blue Water Science (BWS) analyzed FTL's water quality. It was determined that that FTL receives water from many sources and all the sources analyzed showed that the quality of the water coming into the lake was good.
- e. Initiative Foundation Endowment:** Gary Ziehmman gave a report on the current value of the fund.
- f. Newsletter/Website:** Chris Ziehmman reported that in 2106 30% of our website visits were from mobile or handheld devices. Chris believes that our current website is not user friendly, mobile phone friendly and it is difficult to update. She proposed a change to a newer usable website platform. The new site vendor would still be April Powell and the cost would be \$1950.00. Scott Schnuckle motioned to accept this proposal. Peg Hartung seconded it. The motion carried.
- g. Beaver Dams:** Brian Sams reported that there are no beaver dams that are causing an obstruction of water flow.
- h. Board Duties and Responsibilities:** Board duties for the coming year were reviewed.

New Business:

- a. Walleye Stocking:** Mike Flanagan reported that the DNR keeps decreasing the amount of walleye fry to FTL each year. Brian and Mike will speak with the DNR about increasing the stocking number.
- b. Date and Plans for Annual Meeting:** The FTLPOA's Annual Meeting will be Saturday 6/10/17 at 9:30 am at Scandia Valley Township. The LID will meet at 9:00 AM before the FTLPOA meeting.
- c. Adjournment:** Mike Flanagan made a motion to end the meeting. Gary Ziehmman seconded it. The motion carried.

MEMBERSHIP CATEGORIES

Regular Membership - Those persons who are the registered owner(s) of property, or the designees in writing of such owner(s), that has riparian rights on Fish Trap Lake. An individual, family unit, or other entity shall not hold more than one membership and each membership shall be entitled to only one vote irrespective of the amount or number of persons in the family or other entity.

Associate Membership – Those persons who subscribe to the purposes of this Association, but do not qualify for regular membership, may become an associate member but do not have voting rights.

Important update on our Zebra Mussel infestation

As most of you found out last fall when you removed your watercraft, docks and hoists, the volume of zebra mussels attached to your equipment was massive. Virtually anything having contact with the water for an extended period of time had hundreds of mussels attached when removed. They were attached to steel, aluminum, plastic and rubber materials. Based on what we know, this problem will more than likely get worse before it stabilizes.

There is nothing identified currently to reduce or eliminate this aquatic invasive species (AIS). We will continue to monitor all information regarding this problem. We do want to make several suggestions for the upcoming summer.

- When removing any equipment from the lake, please make sure all weeds are removed and all water is drained from the holding areas. Remove all drain plugs from boats and jet skis.
- Make sure there is no water left in your live wells, bait wells and ballast tanks.
- When your watercraft is not in use, make sure the motor is completely out of the water. Any water left in the motor could eventually effect the water pump function and ultimately do damage to the motor.
- When your boat is not in use, make sure your live wells, bait wells and ballast tanks are drained. Any standing water could contain mussels which could affect the functionality of the wells and tanks.

Zebra mussels are a part of our lake and until a solution is found, they will be with us. Today we know of several things they don't do. They don't cause swimmer's itch and they don't kill fish. So we can continue to enjoy our great natural resource as we have in the past. We ask everyone to continue to follow the law in regards to AIS and make sure our friends and neighbors do the same.

Four similar but different Fish Trap Lake Institutions

This is just a quick refresher for those of you who have been on the lake for a while although possibly new information for recent property owners. Fish Trap Lake is governed by multiple levels of government. As a part of the Mississippi River watershed, the federal government through the Army Corp of Engineers has federal jurisdiction in areas affecting federal waters (i.e., the Mississippi Watershed) which it exercised in issuing the permit to BNSF Railroad to fill 13 acres of wetlands (and create 13 acres elsewhere) between Fish Trap Lake and Randall. The next level is state government which through the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency regulates water runoff into the lake and monitors lake pollution levels and through the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (DNR) which regulates lake activity such as fishing, docks and invasive species control. The DNR also monitors lake quality and annually stocks the lake with fish. Morrison County regulates zoning, building permits and works to help address aquatic invasive species. Scandia Valley Township impacts the lake through the oversight of the fire department, first responders, township roads and through input to Morrison County on issues such as the road closure to accommodate BNSF traffic and eliminate train noise.

In addition to federal, state, county and township government, there are three institutions specific to Fish Trap Lake and one to all four area lakes (Fish Trap, Alexander, Crookneck and Shamineau).

First, the **Fish Trap Lake Property Owners Association** was organized in 1973. As required by the articles of incorporation and by-laws, the association board meets at least once per year (although the board traditionally meets three times per year) in addition to the one annual meeting each June. The association has no enforcement powers but collects voluntary nominal annual dues which are used for projects such as information dissemination through the association website, newsletter and meetings; water quality monitoring; environmental quality advocacy; promotion of safe recreation; signage and others. Any dues paid go into the FTLPOA bank account (not the endowment fund) for use towards the above projects.

Second, the **Fish Trap Lake Improvement District** was organized in 2008 to address aquatic invasive species such as curly-leaf pondweed. The LID obtains a permit annually from the DNR and contracts with a business to treat curly-leaf pondweed which, at this point, is the only invasive species it is addressing. There currently is no treatment for zebra mussels. The LID is a governmental entity which operates like a county board with elected officials that vote to determine policy as well as set the annual assessment which is added to your property taxes. This differs from the Association where at the annual meeting all members may vote on issues. The LID is subject to open meeting laws and government procurement rules.

Third, the **Fish Trap Lake Endowment** was set up in 2012 with the Initiative Foundation which matched the first \$10,000 donated by property owners and local business. Interest earned on the approximately \$34,000 now in the endowment is used for special projects to better our lake such as the detailed lake studies conducted by Blue Water Science in 2015 and 2016. All contributions to the Endowment are voluntary.

Fourth, **Quad Lakes** is the name of loosely-organized group that is comprised of representatives from each of the four local lakes – Fish Trap, Alexander, Shamineau and Crookneck. The group has met once or twice each year for approximately five years to discuss common issues and to consider group-wide solutions. Examples of Quad Lake projects are the new invasive species signage posted at each of the four lakes and lake vegetation surveys where the funding for the projects came as a result of a Quad Lake grant application.
