As we awaken to the spring and summer ahead and think of more pleasant things, we have a lot to look forward to on our beautiful lake. With the great support of all of you and especially those that continue to contribute generously to our Foundation, our lake continues to be healthy and a great source of joy and calm for all of us to enjoy. With that said, we need to remain vigilant and continue to protect it from the invasive species that threaten the quality of the water, and health of the ecosystem of our lake.

At our June meeting, we will be discussing the addition of a state-of-the-art cleaning station that Morrison County would be willing to install and pay for, if we are willing to cover the modest maintenance as an Association. This will help protect other area lakes from the spread of zebra mussels and has the potential to protect our lake from Eurasian milfoil and other invasives that exist around our lake region.

I wish I could report that we made progress with the County and the railroad over their impasse that has prevented the closure of the crossing that continues to be a source of risk for train derailment and devastating consequences to our lake. The discussions continue, and we will update you in June.

I am told the lake levels are very high, as we have had a lot of snow melt and rain this spring, please be respectful of others and our shoreline as you enjoy the lake by keeping your boat wakes to a minimum.

I hope this message finds you excited for summer and some warmer weather, and that you, your families and friends are all doing well and staying healthy. Let's make this the best summer of our lives and do great things.

FTLPOA Spring Board Meeting
April 13, 2019
Conference Call 9:30 AM

Board Members Present: Scott Schnuckle, President, Mike Flanagan, Vice President, Gary Ziehmann, Treasurer, Paul Baker, Ron Mash, Chuck Salter, Lisa Kajer, Mary Thibert-Secretary. Non Board member Chris Ziehmann, Newsletter Editor and LID Treasurer.

Board Members Not Present: Jon Scott Johnson, Ron Markfelder, Brian Sams and Dennis Smith.

1. **Secretary's Report:** Minutes from the Fall Board Meeting were submitted and reviewed. No edits were received. Scott motioned that the minutes be accepted. Motion carried.
2. **Treasurer's Report:** Gary Ziehmann submitted the Treasurer's report as of 4/12/19. Total balance of all accounts is \$15,016.18. Total membership for the Fish Trap Lake Property Owner's Association (FTLPOA) for 2018 was 213 or 65%. 2017 membership totaled 212. At this time for 2019 there are 117 members. There are 329 total FTL property owners. The Treasurer's report was accepted by the board.
3. **OLD BUSINESS:**
 - A. **Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) Updates and Plans.** Chris Ziehmann, LID treasurer reported FTL received a grant through MC via Quad Lakes Association of \$3438 for the two AIS vegetation surveys and \$3655 for AIS management.
 - B. **2019 testing:** Scott Schnuckle believes the DNR will continue to monitor the area's lakes for AIS with the public's assistance. The Board believes Brian Sams is still conducting water quality testing for FTL for 2019. Scott will confirm this with Brian. The board continues to look for someone to volunteer to conduct this testing. FTL continues to improve in its water quality by MN Pollution Control standards. RMB Labs posts FTL's data on their website.
 - C. **Railroad Update:** Paul Baker and Scott Schnuckle have had 2 conference calls with Burlington Northern Railroad and MC concerning the Lincoln crossing. The closing of the Lincoln crossing is still at an impasse. The Railroad is willing to concede an easement for the Veterans Trail but remains concerned over the liability.
 - D. **Initiative Foundation:** Chuck Salter reported that the signage project has been completed and the Initiative Fund paid for it. The grant FTLPOA applied for to obtain a CD3 boat cleaning station was not approved. A CD3 station costs anywhere from \$12000-\$35,000. However, MC is considering purchasing said unit for FTL. Details of this potential project will be discussed at the annual meeting. Ideas for use of the Initiative fund projects for 2019 were discussed and will be presented at the annual meeting including creating bat nesting areas and control of FTL water levels. Also, since last fall's DNR fish survey found northern populations high and walleye populations low, that funds might be used to increase the walleye numbers. Eric Altena, from the DNR will be present at the annual meeting to discuss the northern population and how to control their growth and numbers.
 - E. **Website/Newsletter:** Chris reported there are currently 21 businesses who will advertise on the website for 2019. The spring newsletter will be mailed to all POs by mid-May.
 - F. **Board Replacements, Duties, Responsibilities and Projects.** The FTLPOA board has 3 open board positions. The LID also has an open board position. The LID position must be a full-time resident whereas the FTLPOA has no such requirement.
 - G. **Lake Shamineau Project Update:** This project is in flux. Amy Kowalzek will be asked to attend the annual meeting and provide an update on this situation.
4. **New Business**
 - A. **Scandia Valley Fire Department Needs:** Gary Ziehmann reported the Scandia Valley Fire Department has many needs and are the 1st Responders for any emergency on FTL. He suggested a \$1000 donation from FTLPOA funds to the Fire Department. Gary will present this idea at the annual meeting.
 - B. **Wake Boat Wakes:** Scott Schnuckle expressed concern of the waves that are created from wake boats. He feels that they are not good for the lake's shoreline health and believes it is a growing problem. The FTLPOA can only ask that all watercraft owners and operators be respectful of shorelines and property when on the lake; especially during high water levels. If wake boat's wake becomes a problem a PO should call the sheriff.
 - C. **Review Proposed By-law Changes:** The by-laws were reviewed and a change has been proposed. The proposed by-law change is that the FTLPOA board can vote on issues via a teleconference if necessary. The proposed change will be on the website and discussed at the annual meeting.
 - D. **Morrison County 2019 Lake and River Day:** MC 2019 Lake and River Day will be Saturday June 1 from 8:30-12N at the Initiative Foundation in Little Falls. There will be free water testing for nitrates.
 - E. **Set Date and Assignments for the Annual Meeting:** FTLPOA Annual Meeting will be Saturday June 22, 2019 at 9:30 am at Scandia Valley Township Hall. The LID will meet before the meeting at 9 am.

Gary Ziehmann motioned to adjoin the meeting. Lisa Kajer seconded the motion. The motion carried and the meeting adjoined.

FISH TRAP LAKE IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT OPEN BOARD SEATS

The Fish Trap Lake Improvement District, is a governmental entity organized in 2008 to address aquatic invasive species such as curly-leaf pondweed. It operates like a county board with elected officials that vote to determine policy as well as set the annual assessment which is added to your property taxes. The LID board is comprised of five members; three of the five must be permanent residents. With the tragic loss of one of the permanent resident members this past winter, it is critical to fill that vacancy. There are also two other open seats that can be permanent or seasonal residents. High Lake Water Levels Require Caution and Courtesy

With the heavy snowfalls this winter and spring rains, Fish Trap Lake is currently experiencing very high water levels. All users of the lake need to demonstrate caution and courtesy when operating all watercraft on our lake not only at these high water level times but all season to protect valuable shoreline and property from damage caused by strong wave/wake action. The following DNR regulations are provided as friendly reminders:

In Minnesota, it is unlawful to operate or permit the operation of your watercraft in disregard of the rights and safety of others – one specific example is operating a watercraft so that its wash or wake will endanger, bother or unnecessarily interfere with any person or property.

Water skiing, tubing, wake-surfing and similar acts are prohibited between ½ hr after sunset to sunrise of the following day.

Specific to PWCs e.g. jet skis – Personal watercraft must travel at slow no-wake speed (5mph or less) within 150 ft. of non-motorized boats, shore (unless launching or landing skiers directly to or from shore or from open water), docks, swim rafts. Operation of PWCs is allowed only from 9:30 a.m. to 1 hr before sunset.

We all enjoy the beauty and benefits of our lake. Please be mindful of others and practice safety and courtesy when on the water.

FLOATING BOGS & WHAT TO DO

Excerpt from the Minnesota DNR website:

Floating bogs

Who is responsible for removing a bog that floated across the lake and lodged on my shoreline? Is a DNR permit required to remove it?

If a floating bog becomes a nuisance, it is the responsibility of the property owner(s) where the bog is grounded to move the bog to an acceptable location. Moving a floating bog away from your property requires a DNR aquatic plant management permit issued through the DNR Regional Fisheries Office. DNR responsibility is limited to the following:

- Provide advice and approval on bog disposition.
- Remove any floating bogs lodged on state owned dams or other DNR property.

NOTE: Minnesota Rules 6280 describes permit requirements relating to the removal of aquatic vegetation. See also Aquatic Vegetation.

Proposed Change to the Fish Trap Lake Property Owners Association By-laws to Allow Remote Participation

In light of multiple instances of inclement weather resulting in cancellation of scheduled board meetings, the FTLPOA directors have proposed the following change/addition to the Association by-laws:

Section 9. Remote Participation. A board member may participate in a meeting by means of remote communication such as a conference telephone or other means by which persons not physically present in the same location may communicate with each other during the meeting. Member participation by remote communication constitutes presence at the meeting and entitles that member to vote. At least one board member must be present at the scheduled meeting location.

Following discussion at the annual meeting, the board will vote on the proposed change and a final copy of the full Association by-laws will be available for viewing on the <fishtraplake.com> website.
