## A Note from the President

I hope this message finds you all enjoying the spring and early opportunities to enjoy your lake places. What a weird year, with a winter that really wasn't a winter and perhaps the shortest period of ice cover on the lake ever, certainly in recent history. While we all enjoyed the benefits of the warmer winter with relatively little snow removal work and a more comfortable time outdoors, this winter was tough on resorts and others who rely on ice covered lakes and snowy trails for their businesses. It may also have been tough on the lake conditions, especially weed growth. It will be interesting to observe as we move into summer.

Before I highlight what's happening at our upcoming Annual Meeting and some of our Board efforts, I would like to acknowledge the loss of a very valued member of our lake's community. FTLPOA Board member Jon-Scott Johnson passed away on April 6, a week before he was scheduled to join us at our spring board meeting. Jon-Scott and his wife Lucy have been active members of the lake, serving both the property owners board and the Lake Improvement District (LID) board. Jon-Scott also gave generously of his time to other endeavors such as youth ministry at his church, Habitat for Humanity and refurbishing bicycles to benefit charitable organizations. We will miss him; and the Board voted to make a modest donation to plant three trees in memoriam for him, which was the family's preferred choice.

By the time you receive this newsletter, the LID will have contracted treatment of 39 acres of curly-leaf pondweed which had to be done earlier this year due to the warmer water conditions. The survey actually found 67 acres with emerging curly-leaf pondweed, but the DNR limited our treatment to 39 acres – they double-checked the findings of Limnopro and disagreed with their analysis. Limnopro plans to prove their findings with a follow-up assessment, but the DNR decision is final for 2024.

Weeds and weed control are a frequent topic across Minnesota lakes, and as you may remember, we hired Blue Water Science (BWS) to study our lake in August of last year. That report is posted on our website <fishtraplake.com> and Steve McComas, owner of BWS, will be present at our Annual Meeting to discuss his findings and share his thoughts on invasive and native weeds, zebra mussels, the state of the Fish Trap Lake fishery and respond to other questions you may have. In addition, we will be joined by Land Services Director Amy Kowalzek from Morrison County to update us on the revised Shoreland Use Ordinances, Sheriff Shawn Larson and others most likely including elected officials from the County and State. Please plan to join us on June 22 at Scandia Valley Town Hall. The details are posted on our website.

You may have noticed we have posted signage at each of our access points to the lake asking walleye fishermen and women to consider releasing walleyes that are less than 15 inches to help improve our supply of larger walleyes. The program is voluntary, but your support would be greatly appreciated.

I hope to see you in June at the Annual Meeting. We have a lot happening and please consider volunteering on the Board. We have openings on the FTLPOA Board and the LID Board is seeking one more full-time lake resident to serve. **Absent:** Paul Baker and Brian Sams. Ron Nypan has resigned from the board so we will need to replace his Vice President role.

**Meeting called to order 9:30**

**Recognition of Jon-Scott Johnson's Passing:** Residents of St. Cloud, both Jon-Scott and his wife Lucy were big contributors to their communities and to the lake. He will be missed. As of our meeting, there hadn't been an obituary with memorial arrangements. Chuck motioned the board contribute a \$100 memorial to a charity TBD. Gary seconded. Motion carried.

**Secretary's Report**—Gary motioned to approve the minutes from our Fall board meeting. Mary seconded. Report accepted.

**Treasurer's Report**—Financial report was reviewed and accepted. The ending balance for 2023 was \$22,661.93 for all accounts. In 2023 we achieved a membership record of 224 members. So far this year we have 143 pre-paid members.

**Old Business**

**CD3 Boat Cleaning Station Update** (Chuck) – As of our meeting last fall, the holding tank was at 19%. Chuck checked and it's recommended we should be pumping when tank is 10% filled. He found someone to pump water & weeds for \$50 and will submit the invoice for reimbursement.

**Initiative Foundation Endowment Fund** (Gary) – Current year contribution to the endowment fund is \$375 making the current value of the fund \$75,581.75. Ideas for uses of the fund to improve the lake are welcome.

**Water Levels and Beaver Management** (Scott provided Brian's update) -- We have another beaver dam, right over the top of the pipeline so it will need to be removed by hand. Brian has been on the phone with the pipeline ownership, county and soil & water to get the dam removed. Nine beavers were removed last fall so we're hoping that will greatly reduce cutting activity this year. The lake is up about 10".

**Website/Newsletter** (Chris) -- There continues to be confusion about celery weed (people think it's curly-leaf pondweed). Chris will post the State of the Lake report on the website and include the one-page summary in the newsletter, inviting people to read the full report on the website. We also had discussion about treating trees for two-line chestnut borers and emerald ash borers with a reminder that it's illegal to transport firewood out of the county. Chuck will check with Shannon Wettstein from soil & water about tree issues. Chris will also post notice of the two board positions we need to replace (Jon Scott Johnson and Ron Nypan).

**New Business**

**LID Updates** (Tom/Chris) -- DNR has notified us they are pushing up weed treatment dates to be done by end of April (instead of the typical mid-May). Limnopro Aquatic Science is our new testing provider. This week they mapped where the weeds are and we should have the shape files soon identifying acreage of curly-leaf. Lake Restoration will do the weed control treatment. John did a wonderful job getting all our grants approved from the state and county. We've had two years of massive weed treatment areas (more than previous years) and costs of weed control are higher. The LID voted at the annual meeting to raise assessment from \$60 to \$100 per property to increase their operating balance. Paul at Lake Restoration is confident the amount of treatment last year will result in less for this year, keeping the LID budget in the black. Will treat as much as the DNR approves. There will be a follow-up assessment in the fall to ensure effectiveness of weed treatment. The more curly-leaf that is removed, the more likely native celery grass weed (*Vallisneria americana*) or other weeds will come in. Tom wants to train some others on how to do dip testing for zebra mussels. Of five positions on the LID, three must be full-time residents of the lake. Ron Nypan has resigned from the LID so his position will need to be replaced with a full-time lake resident. Gary will give Tom and Scott a list of permanent residents for potential recruitment.

**Fishery** (Mike Flanagan) – It takes four years for walleye to mature from hatchery fingerlings to 15". Mike was approached by others concerned about people keeping walleyes less than 15" and shared a sign posted at Howard Lake asking fishers to voluntarily release walleye less than 15". Mike checked with the DNR who supported the idea. We would modify the sign slightly as shown here. Gary motioned we authorize up to \$300 to produce six signs to be installed and maintained by volunteers at the public landing and elsewhere around the lake. Chuck seconded. Motion carried. The signs should be produced by May 5<sup>th</sup>.

**Morrison County Updates** (Scott) – Amy Kowalzek says they've been focusing on agricultural areas of the county the last couple years and now they're proposing some changes in lakeshore use ordinances. There is a public hearing scheduled May 14<sup>th</sup> with changes effective June 1<sup>st</sup>. Chris will put a notice on the website about the public hearing and Tom will mimic the notice and send to Laura, the admin for Fish Trap Facebook page. Amy will be present at our annual meeting at the Town Hall to review the changes. Many of the changes are based on variances requested/approved in the past to simplify processes and make guidelines more reasonable.

# State of the Lake Summary

**Shoreland Conditions:** Much of the lake shoreland is in excellent natural condition. However, a shoreland survey in 2015 indicated a total of about 43 parcels could improve natural shoreline buffer conditions with a 15 to 25 foot deep growth of native vegetation along at least 50% of their shoreline.

**Groundwater Springs:** Two areas of major groundwater inflow apparently were detected. Ground inflow, or springs, are likely common in Fish Trap Lake.

**Water Quality:** Water quality as measured by clarity (using a Secchi disc), nutrients (phosphorus), and algae (measured with chlorophyll) are within ranges of unimpacted lakes in the Northern Lakes and Forest ecoregion. The water quality in Fish Trap Lake is very good.

**Algae and Zooplankton:** Typical algae and zooplankton species are found in Fish Trap Lake. Although blue-green algae are present (cyanobacteria sometimes develop toxic strains) however their density is low and they are not harmful to pets or swimmers.

**Aquatic Plants:** A good diversity and at least 37 aquatic and shoreline plants have been identified. This diversity supports excellent water quality and fish habitat. Curlyleaf pondweed, a non-native plant, is present and is managed on as-needed basis. Eurasian watermilfoil, a non-native species, was not observed in 2023.

**Zebra Mussels:** The first observation was on June 30, 2015. A follow-up two-day survey by MnDNR found zebra mussels at 21 locations. They are past the point of eradication. Their growth will be abundant for a couple of years and then they will likely become food limited and their numbers will decrease. Zebra mussel distribution was surveyed in 2023 and were found around the lake with higher occurrence in the east end of Fish Trap Lake.

**Fish:** Several gamefish species such as walleyes, largemouth bass, yellow perch, and northern pike are present in Fish Trap Lake at or above regional densities. The 2014 and 2021 fish surveys found 14-17 fish species indicating a good diversity as well as good predator-prey interactions.

**Lake Protection Projects:** Fish Trap Lake has good water quality conditions. Expensive restoration projects are not needed at this time. Rather maintenance projects such as curlyleaf pondweed control, and protection projects such as installing and maintaining shoreland buffer strips are recommended. Lake residents can also help protect lake water quality by implementing good housekeeping projects that include low fertilizer use and enhancing native vegetation in shoreland areas. Ongoing monitoring should also continue.

## **Voluntary Release of Smaller Walleyes**

Several property owners have requested that we encourage those fishing on our lake to release smaller walleyes. It appears the stocking plan the DNR has in place for Fish Trap is working. There have been reports of many walleyes being caught in the 10 to 12 inch range in the last couple of years. A 12 inch walleye will grow to be 15 to 16 inches over the next year. 15 to 18 inch walleyes are the best tasting filets. With permission from several agencies of the DNR the Board has voted to support a VOLUNTARY release of walleyes under 15 inches. Signs will be posted at the public landing and several other key areas of the lake. Remember, this is purely voluntary. But if you do catch a smaller walleye that would probably die when released, please keep that fish. Thank you for supporting our great fishery.

## **Increasing Risks to our Oak, Ash and Elm Trees**

Property owners on Fish Trap Lake continue to battle infestations impacting our trees. As noted in several previous articles available on our website, two-lined chestnut borer has killed many oak trees (primarily red oaks) on the lake and continues to be a threat to stressed oak trees, such as trees stressed by drought. The insect bores multiple lines around the circumference of a tree, cutting off the supply of nutrients above the infected area and killing the tree. Insecticides can be applied to the trunk of the tree or soil surrounding an oak tree to help protect the tree but if the insects have already girdled the tree, the trees days are numbered. In addition to the infestation of two-lined chestnut borer, there are several additional insects and fungal diseases now found in Morrison County. Emerald ash borer and oak wilt are both in Morrison County but not yet identified on property west of the Mississippi River. Dutch elm disease has been in our county for multiple years but does not infect all elm trees as trees such as the St. Croix American elm are resistant.

**We want to remind everyone to please be courteous and cautious when operating all watercraft on our lake to protect valuable shoreline, property and persons from damage or injury caused by strong wave/wake action. The following DNR regulations are provided as friendly reminders:**

1. It is unlawful to operate your watercraft in disregard of the rights and safety of others – one specific example is operating a watercraft so that its wash or wake will endanger, bother or unnecessarily interfere with any person or property.
2. Water skiing, tubing, wake-surfing and similar acts are prohibited between ½ hr after sunset to sunrise of the next day.
3. Specific to PWCs e.g. jet skis – Personal watercraft must travel at slow no-wake speed (5mph or less) within 150 ft. of non-motorized boats, shore (unless launching or landing skiers directly to or from open water), docks, swim rafts, swimmers or any moored or anchored boat. Operation of PWCs is allowed only from 9:30 a.m. to 1 hour before sunset.

**We all enjoy the beauty and benefits of our lake. Please be mindful of others and practice safety and courtesy when on the water.**
